### Insurance Certificates

**Coordinators:** If your facility is requesting a certificate showing that Pet-A-Pet carries liability insurance, please contact our treasurer, Lyn Ehrman (see page 2). The treasurer will notify our insurance agency and the certificate of insurance will be sent to your facility.

The following information is required:

- The complete name, street address, city, state and ZIP code of the facility.
- The complete name, title, telephone number and e-mail address of the facility employee who is requesting or should receive the certificate.

**Please note:** We currently renew our insurance policy in December. The certificate will show that a policy is in force until December.

**Pet-A-Pet Club policy is that only scheduled group visits are covered under our insurance.**

### Help us keep up to date:

- **Please fill out and submit the Coordinator/Facility form annually**, when sending renewals. Send all coordinator forms, registration forms and dues to Lyn Ehrman.
- **Remind your volunteers** to notify Lyn of any change of address or contact information.
- If you need **additional registration forms**, contact Pat Glinski

- **Pet scarves should be ordered from Cathy Totzkay** for new volunteers. **Pets are to wear their scarves on visits and handlers should wear a Pet-A-Pet button** (Cathy has these also), if they don't have a club shirt.

# Please Be a Coordinator!

3. Must be a member in good standing for at least 6 months.
4. Must have paperwork orientation by referring coordinator or Coordinator Director.
5. Pet-A-Pet Board will have final approval of new coordinators.
6. There should be a minimum of two pet & handler teams to start visits at a new facility.

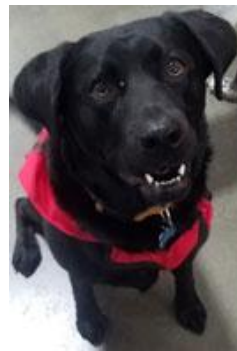
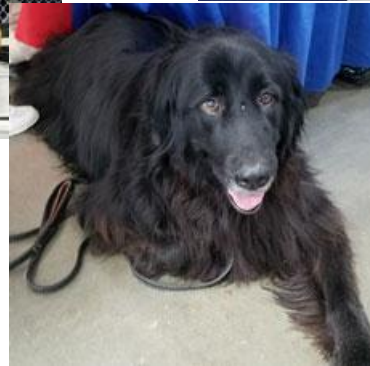

## Pet First Aid Kits

### Familiarize Yourself

Don't wait until the last minute to figure out how and when to use the items in your first aid kit. Learn the signs and symptoms of a true emergency, as well as the basics of the items in your kit, so you're ready if something happens.

#### Major Symptoms to Look Out For Include:

- + Rapid breathing or excessive panting
- + Pale or yellow gums
- + Loss of consciousness
- + Difficulty standing
- + Inability to walk
- + Bloated abdomen
- + Fever
- + Tremors or seizures
- + Excessive whimpering or whining
- + Vomiting more than three times
- + Inability to rest

### What to Put in Your Pet's First Aid Kit

- Latex gloves (or other hypoallergenic material)
- Gauze rolls and pads
- Tweezers
- Digital thermometer
- Clean blanket or towel
- Hydrogen peroxide (3%)
- Topical antibiotic ointment
- Instant cold pack
- Antiseptic towelettes
- Small flashlight
- Sterile saline wash
- Sterile eye lubricant
- Eye dropper
- Small scissors
- Magnifying glass
- Tongue depressors
- Non-adhesive sterile pads
- Petroleum jelly
- Cotton-tipped swabs
- Medical Tape
- Elastic cling bandage
- Muzzle
- Diphenhydramine (aka Benadryl -- get approval from your veterinarian first)

**Don't Forget:** Be sure to include a list of emergency numbers, including the number for your regular vet, emergency vet, animal control and animal poison control.

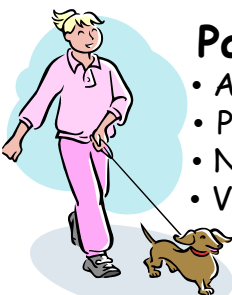

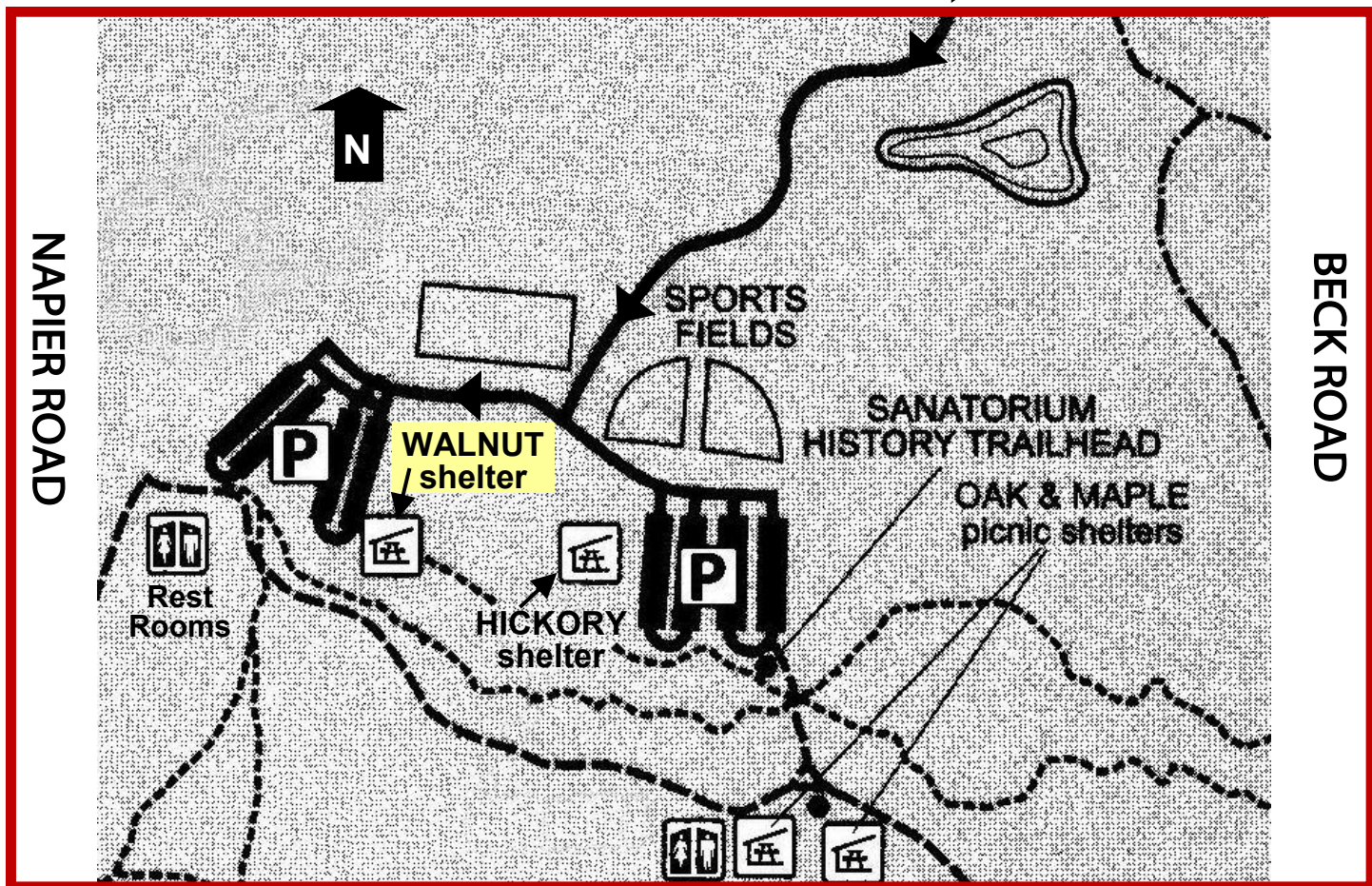

## Aah, Springtime!

Before you embark on seasonal chores or outdoor revelry, take inventory of potential springtime hazards for your furry friends.



**Screens** Many pet parents welcome the breezy days of spring by opening their windows. Unfortunately, they also unknowingly put their pets at risk—especially cats, who are apt to jump or fall through unscreened windows. Be sure to install snug and sturdy screens in all of your windows.

**Buckle Up!** While most dogs love to feel the wind on their furry faces, allowing them to stick their heads out of moving-car windows is dangerous. Flying debris and insects can cause inner ear or eye injuries and lung infections, and abrupt stops or turns can cause major injury, or worse! Pets riding in cars should always be secured in a crate or in the back seat wearing a seatbelt harness designed especially for them.



**Spring Cleaning** Be sure to keep all cleaners and chemicals out of your pets' way! Almost all cleaning products, even all natural ones, contain chemicals that may be harmful to pets. The key to using them safely is to read and follow label directions for proper use and storage.



**Home Improvement** Products such as paints, mineral spirits and solvents can be toxic to your pets and cause severe irritation or chemical burns. Carefully read all labels to see if the product is safe to use around your furry friends.



Also, be cautious of physical hazards, including nails, staples, insulation, blades and power tools. It may be wise to confine your dog or cat to a designated pet-friendly room during home improvement projects.

**Let Your Garden Grow** Fertilizers, insecticides and herbicides keep our plants and lawns healthy and green, but their ingredients may be dangerous if your pet ingests them. Always store these products in out-of-the-way places and follow label instructions carefully. Many popular springtime plants—including rhododendron and azaleas—are also highly toxic to pets and can prove fatal if eaten.



**Ah-Ah-Achoo!** Pets can be allergic to foods, dust, plants and pollens. Allergic reactions in dogs and cats can cause itching, minor sniffing and sneezing, or life-threatening anaphylactic shock to insect bites and stings. If you suspect your pet has a springtime allergy, please visit your veterinarian as soon as possible.



**Pesky Little Critters** Make sure your pet is on year-round heartworm preventive medication, as well as a flea & tick control program. Ask your doctor to recommend a plan designed specifically for your pet.

**Out and About** More trips to the park and longer walks make for more chances for your pet to wander off! Make sure your dog or cat has a microchip for identification and wears a tag imprinted with relevant contact information.
